Council roles and responsibilities

The Council's mandate is to support the Town and its activities, all the while ensuring the well-being of the residents and the Town. This includes:

- Being accountable for the transparency of Town operations, including the activities of senior management.

Town Council meetings

A brief history of Hawkesbury

Situated on one of North America's oldest trade routes, the Town of Hawkesbury has long been in a strategic location. It was once occupied by aboriginal peoples, for whom the Ottawa River acted as an important link between the Great Lakes region and the northeastern part of the continent.

Hawkesbury was incorporated as a town in 1896 and has a long history of industry that began with lumber. The Town has since diversified and continues to grow its industrial and services sectors.

Like many first-generation industrial towns, Hawkesbury's history is punctuated by key events that have had a major impact on its social, economic, and territorial development. Nevertheless, the Town and its residents have demonstrated the ability to adapt and continue to do so in the present era.










An Overview of Hawkesbury

Clerk's Department

The Clerk's Department manages all legal aspects of Council and the administration. The department prepares and coordinates meetings, manages the archives, creates, and manages electoral processes during municipal elections. The department also offers many services to the residents of Hawkesbury:

COMMISSIONER OF OATHS

Under the *Commissioners for Taking Affidavits Act, 1990*, Clerks and Deputy Clerks, by virtue of office, are commissioners for taking affidavits in Ontario. This service can be used is therefore used for all documents requiring an written statement confirmed by oath.

INSURANCE CLAIMS

The Clerk's Department handles insurance claims. PLease note that you must contact your insurance company and pass on the information to them.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUESTS

Under the *Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, 1990 (MFIPPA), these requests give access to certain documents containing general and/or personal information.

MARRIAGE LICENCES AND CIVIL CEREMONIES

Under the *Marriage Act, 1990*, the Clerk's Department can issue marriage licenses. The Town of Hawkesbury also offers civil ceremony services.



Finance and Taxes



WHERE DO YOUR PROPERTY TAXES GO?

Although your property taxes are collected on the same taxe bill, the amount is shared between the Town (66%), the United Counties (25%) and the School Boards (9%). Property taxes in the Town of Hawkesbury represent approximately 50% of total revenues. The taxes collected are used to finance expenses associated with the Town of Hawkesbury's services and maintenance.

Over 84% of property taxes are invested in providing services and maintaining the Town. The town of Hawkesbury, like the majority of municipalities, adheres to the «user pays» principle for garbage, sewer and water services.

When do we pay our property taxes?

There are two tax bills per year (for a total of four):
the interim bill (50% of the previous year's amount) in two,
one at the end of March, and one at the end of June;
the final bill in two due at the end of September and November.

4 payments

- March
- September
- June
- November

Water/sewer/garbage service charges

There are four invoices per year,

Due on the last working day of

January - April - July - October

- Each bill represents three months' consumption.
- Each bill also includes a fixed rate for water, for sewer, and for garbage collection.
 - A penalty of 1.25% per month is applied to all unpaid accounts.



In case of changes to your banking information, a change of address, or if you wish to cancel your pre-authorized debit payment, kindly notify us at least 15 days before the due date.

Environment Services

(water supply and wastewater management)

About us

We are responsible for the operation of the drinking water filtration plant, the drinking water distribution network and the wastewater treatment plant. Our service operates 24/7, and is managed by a certified and licensed multidisciplinary team.



What is our mission?

- · Provide safe, clean drinking water to all our citizens and customers
- Maintain and continually improve our drinking water quality management system
- · Ensure effective wastewater treatment
- · Comply with all applicable drinking water and wastewater laws and regulations.

The Town of Hawkesbury's state-of-the-art infrastructure enables the municipality to meet these commitments and to accommodate future economic development in the residential, commercial and industrial sectors.

Responsible drinking water management. An accessible task!

A water meter is a tool for conserving water. Not only does it measure and record the volume of water consumed, it also helps detect leaks in homes and businesses. Studies have shown that metered homes use less water than unmetered homes.

Here are a **few tips** to help you avoid wasting water and prevent sudden increases on your water bill :



- · Check for leaks, preferably once a year
- Repair leaky tanks and pipes
- · Turn off the main water valve when you're away on vacation or for an extended period

Did you know ...?

A continuous water leak caused by a 6 mm (1/4") hole will cause you to lose 4,475 cubic meters of water over three months - almost 5 times the amount of water in the Sports Complex pool!

Who is responsible for underground infrastructures?

The Town of Hawkesbury has partnered with Service Line Warranties of Canada (SLWC) since 2021 to offer Hawkesbury homeowners optional protection plans to cover potentially high repair costs associated with water and sewer lines located on the private portion of the system. Wastewater Treatment Plant Every gesture counts - you're part of the solution!

Many items should not be flushed down sinks, drains, or toilets, as they can cause blockages in municipal sanitary sewers and wastewater treatment plants, including residential sanitary systems!

To avoid such situations, the following types of products should never be flushed away:

- Hygiene products
 (towels, diapers, cotton balls, dental floss, bandages, wipes even those labeled "flushable")
- Food products (fats, oils, foods)
- Household products (paint, pesticides, solvents, nail polish remover, cleaning products)
- Other (hair, contact lenses, medications, cat litter, paper towels, cigarettes)



When to contact us?

- If you have questions related to leaks, interruptions, pressure, taste, odour or colour of drinking water
- 2. If you're planning to dig for earthworks, paving or plumbing
- 3. Contact us preferably 48 hours in advance if you need to:
- · Locate your water main because it's not visible, to have it raised, lowered, or repaired.
- Make a request to close or open the water supply.

Public Works

What is our mission?

The Public Works Department takes care of many town infrastructures, with a main focus on ensuring the safety of drivers, pedestrians, and cyclists. This includes overseeing a road network spanning over 60 kilometers, along with maintaining more than 32 kilometers of sidewalks, shoulders, bridges, culverts, and ditches.

Street maintenance in winter?

The department's winter maintenance program includes salting and sanding, snow plowing and snow removal. All street maintenance programs comply with provincial standards. Refer to the snow clearing protocol below.

The department is also responsible for carrying out and/or supervising improvements or repairs to sanitary and storm sewers.

Snow removal on our sidewalks?

During winter, Public works tasks include coordinating snow removal on all sidewalks in the town of Hawkesbury. According to Ontario standards, the municipality has 48 hours to clear snow from sidewalks. However, the safety of residents is a priority and our staff works diligently to clear sidewalks within a reasonable time.





Did you know... -

During a winter storm, three operators tackle the 32 kilometers of sidewalks in the town in 8 to 10 hours, continuing their work during and after the storm



Construction Department

When is a building permit required?

- · Construction of a new building;
- Installation of new plumbing in the building or changes to existing plumbing;
- Changes to the use of a building; construction of an addition to an existing building; adding
 or removing a structural wall in a building; modifying an existing building; raising a building
 to add a basement;
- Changing the combustion source of a fireplace from gas to solid fuel;
- · Building a patio, deck, attached or detached garage, permanent carport, and/or solarium;
- Installing a furnace with a new combustion system; installing solid-fuel burning equipment; completing rough-in work on a fireplace;
- Erecting an above-ground or in-ground pool or a hot tub (Jacuzzi);
- · Replacing exterior siding or installing a skylight; and
- · Installing a sign.

When is a building permit not required?



Even if a permit is not required, you must comply with the requirements of the Town's zoning by-law and, if applicable, the *Building Code Act, 1992*.

- Retaining walls no higher than 1 meter (39.4 inches);
- Paving and residential entrances; horticulture;
- Replacement of plumbing accessories for water heaters, kitchen or bathroom cabinets of the same dimensions; roof shingles (residential);
- · Painting, decorating and general maintenance;
- Addition of air conditioning units or heat pump to existing system and/or furnace with similar combustion and heat output;
- Accessory buildings, storage sheds not exceeding 15 m² (161.45 ft²).

You must comply with the requirements of the Town's zoning by-law and, if applicable, the Building Code Act, 1992.

Waste collection services

Residences are served by weekly garbage and recycling collections, the day being determined by location (see collection map - page 20). Details and schedules can be found on the collection calendar and on our website at www.hawkesbury.ca/en/garbage.

GARBAGE - Town of Hawkesbury grey rolling bins

Garbage must be placed in a designated garbage bin bearing the Town logo. Designated bins come with a serial number, as well as an RFID chip that allows bins to be assigned to each address, improving the automated collection service. If you're buying a house, the designated bin must be left behind by the previous owner, as each bin is assigned to a specific property. If you are purchasing a newly constructed house, you must contact the Town to schedule delivery of your designated garbage bin.


Waste collection services



Did you know?

That there are 2 different sizes of grey bins. Commercial and multi-residential (5 units or more) buildings use $360\ L$ garbage bins.

Each residential unit in a building with 4 or less units (detached house, duplex, triplex, or quadruplex) has one 240L garbage bin, by default.



Garbage Bin Placement

Designated garbage and recycling bins must be placed on your property, at the sidewalk or curb, no earlier than 5 p.m. the day prior to collection, and before 6 a.m. on collection day. Garbage must be placed in a designated garbage bin with the Town logo facing the street. Keep 1m (3ft) on all sides of the bin clear of obstacles (including other containers).

Note: Wheels and handles must face your home.



Waste collection services

What are the costs associated with municipal garbage collection?

There are two different costs associated with municipal garbage collection that are billed via the quarterly water/sewer/garbage bills:

- 1. The purchase fee for designated bins (one-time fee)
- 2. Annual service charge (recurring annually, divided into four quarterly payments)

The cost of purchasing a bin is billed to the <u>owner</u>. This purchase fee will vary to reflect the purchase cost incurred by the Town at the time of your request.


Annual service charges for garbage collections are set each year based on operating costs. These service charges vary according to the volume of waste produced by a property, with different rates for 240 L and 360 L bins. This establishes an equitable model based on the "user pays" principle, where only owners who use certain services pay for them. In addition, separate fees apply to waste diversion programs and are charged according to the type of unit (residential or commercial) on a property, as these waste diversion initiatives are not limited in volume.



Excess garbage?

The quantity of garbage per unit is limited to the volume of the designated bin (with the lid closed). Excess garbage is accepted only if placed curbside in a garbage bag properly identified with a label specially provided by the Town. These excess garbage bags must not exceed 13.6 kg (30 lb) each and must be placed next to a designated grey bin serviced by the Town collection. Extra garbage bag tags can be purchased at Town Hall, in sets of three (3), for \$10.

Note: If your household regularly produces more waste than your bin contains, please write to us to request an additional bin. Please note that garbage fees are calculated per bin, so additional bins will incur additional costs.



Application process for an additional garbage bin.

The owner must write by e-mail to tp-pw@hawkesbury.ca, or by mail to Town Hall at 600 Higginson Street, Hawkesbury, ON K6A 1H1.

Include the following in your request:

- 1. Full name (or name of owner company)
 - 2. Full address (service address)
- 3. Request specifications (more or less bins, quantity)
- 4. Your utility bill roll number (account number)
- (18 digits at the top of your water/sewer/garbage bill see p.11)
- 5. Please note that any request submitted implies acceptance of the additional costs.

Recycling



Recycling can be placed at the curb in your choice of the following four containers:

- Blue box
- Blue wheeled bin, European grip is preferable
- Blue/transparent bags
- Cardboard boxes, under 76 cm (30")

The 1st blue box is free for new households. Each additional box costs \$15.

Accepted yard waste includes leaves, branches and plants. Visit the website for the complete list.

NO food waste, whole trees or stumps.

All branches must be bundled and placed perpendicular to the street.

Bundles of branches must measure less than 30 cm (12 in.) in diameter and 1 m (39.3 in.) in length.

Yard waste must be placed at the curb, either in compostable paper bags or in a covered container.

Public Safety

Municipal By-law Enforcement Division

The purpose of municipal by-law enforcement is to ensure that the public respects the various municipal regulations. By-law Enforcement Officers are responsible for ensuring respect amongst residents and visitors, reinforcing property standards, clean yards, and parking by-laws, and more. They are also responsible for issuing business licenses, taxi permits and much more.

DO I NEED A DOG LICENCE?



Answer: YES!

All citizens must register their dog(s). Registration takes place at Town Hall. Licenses must be renewed annually by March 15. Each household is authorized to own a maximum of two dogs. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that his or her dog complies with noise, equipment and safety regulations. All dogs must be kept on a leash, when off your property.

Under the *Municipal Act, 2001*, a resident must apply for a permit to hold a fireworks event. It is up to the Municipality to prescribe the conditions under which fireworks displays may be held under this permit.



CAN I SET OFF

Answer: YES, but...!







Can we have garage sales? Does it cost anything?



A permit is required to hold a garage sale. The cost is \$10 for 2 consecutive days. Two garage sales per year are permitted per civic address. Council has granted two free garage sales weekend per year:

The last weekend of May, and the October long weekend

Answer: YES AND YES!

Between November 15 and April 15, parking on all Town streets is prohibited between midnight and 7 am, regardless of weather conditions. In addition, certain areas will be off-limits during snow-clearing operations.

Answer: NO!

Can I file a complaint if I see violations of municipal by-laws?



Answer: YES!

There are two ways to file a complaint:

Response times may vary depending on the time of the request. The identification of the complainant remains confidential, unless legal action is to be taken and the complainant's testimony is required.

Anonymous complaints are not accepted.

What should I do if I receive a parking ticket?

You must pay the fine.

All parking tickets can be paid in person at the Finance Department (Door 3) at Town Hall (by cash, debit or credit card) or directly on our website using a credit card at the following secure address: https://ipn.paymentus.com/cp/hawk?lang=en.

You contest the fine.

You can contest a ticket by filling out the back of the notice of infraction within 15 days of receiving it, and dropping it off or mailing it to the address on the back of your ticket. Failure to do so may result in a guilty plea if the fine is not paid.


